

Camp Sawtooth - CABIN COUNSELOR – A Volunteer Position

Brief outline of Cabin Counselor Responsibilities

1. Seven positions are available; 3 male and 4 female.
2. Counselors are expected to attend a training and information meeting at 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, the first day of camp.
3. A Counselor will be paired with a Program Staff Counselor.
4. The Counselor will assist the Program Staff Counselor and together you will care for a cabin group of 9 to 12 campers for the week.
5. Counselors will lead, teach, share life experiences and participate in all program activities and meals.
6. Counselors will be present in the cabins during rest hours.
7. Counselors must know the location of their campers at all times.
8. Counselors must be High School graduates or at least 18 years of age (exceptions for 3rd-4th Grade Camp and 5th-6th Grade Camps may be granted with the combined approval of Camp Directors and Camp Dean).
9. Counselors are responsible for the care and Christian nurture of their assigned campers; and the community well-being of the cabin group.

Cabin Counselor applicants must complete a Camp Sawtooth Volunteer Cabin Counselor Application Form.

- ◆ This is an excellent opportunity for volunteers to use their gifts and to be spiritually renewed. The camp experience will enable the Counselor to grow in Christian faith while helping others to do the same. It will be a week of fun, friendship, growth and memories.
- ◆ Room and meals are provided for the week.
- ◆ Counselors may receive a 50% paid campership for one of their own children, per camp counseled. Camperships are nontransferable.
- ◆ Confirmation will be sent within 3 weeks
